The Ken Martin Scholarship for Excellence in Communication

The TAHU Honorees Corporation, a non-profit public benefit corporation established and supported by members of the Texas Association of Health Underwriters, offers the Ken Martin Scholarship for Excellence in Communication, established in 2002, for Texas students entering or attending accredited institutions of higher learning. Other than the recipient being a successful student, the Ken Martin family wishes for the selected student to exemplify communications experience and expertise demonstrated by awards and recognition for debate or essay writing, having been editor or staff member for a school paper or yearbook, having served as an announcer for a school or community event, or participating in dramatics or film making. The applicants' college major is not a significant selection criterion. The scholarship award is to promote the proper written and spoken use of the English language. Ken Martin used this proficiency as an accomplished published writer and orator in support of the insurance industry, his chosen profession. The scholarship goal is for the recipient to use this same proficiency in communications in whatever career field is chosen. The purpose of the scholarship is to assist a student who may not have top grades but who has demonstrated the desire to communicate ideas.

Guidelines

The Ken Martin Scholarship for Excellence in Communication award will be evaluated based on these guidelines:

1. The student's intent to seek a degree at an accredited educational institution of their choice.
2. Residency in Texas and a US citizen. Texas based educational institution not required.
3. Consideration of all factors, other than scholastic achievement, will be deemed relevant by the Board of the TAHU Honorees Corporation without regard to race, gender, color, ethnic origin, religious belief, marital status or physical handicap,
4. Submission of a complete, signed original application to Ken Martin Scholarship, TAHU Honorees Corporation, P.O. Box 381506, Duncanville, TX 75138-1506, with the following:
 - a. An applicant's essay of not more than 500 words detailing the impact and importance of communications in the applicant's life,
 - b. An official, certified high school transcript or GED,
 - c. History of employment, school and/or public service activities,
 - d. Certification of SAT/ACT scores, if not included on high school transcript,
 - e. Samples of proficiency, experience and expertise in communications.
